What to expect:

FBN is coordinator of the European Infrastructure project EuroFAANG (HORIZON-INFRA-2022-DEV-01 Research Infrastructure Concept Development), which is a collaborative consortium of seven institutions from universities (Wageningen, Edinburgh, NMBU), research institutes (INRAE, FBN, EMBL-EBI) and stakeholder organisations (EFFAB) across Europe. The goal of the EuroFAANG infrastructure is to streamline use of interdisciplinary capabilities for genotype to phenotype research in terrestrial and aquatic farmed animals. To this end, EuroFAANG will develop concepts to bring together national facilities at the pan-European level in the field of animal genetic resources, phenotyping and breeding, and animal health. The outcomes of EuroFAANG will lead to an improved landscape of European research infrastructures for the advancement of excellent farmed animal science and frontier genotype to phenotype research in Europe and globally.
